## H. Spring Conference

The conference was held on Friday, March 27<sup>th</sup> at Brookhaven National Lab. The conference was an astounding success. The day began with a brief welcome by Glen Cochrane and Brookhaven Lab administrators Mel Morris and Scott Bronson from the office of educational programs. This was followed by our keynote presentation. Dr. Krause, a vertebrate paleontologist from Stony Brook University gave an excellent presentation his latest research on discoveries from the Cretaceous of Madagascar. Brian Vorwald gave a brief update on the status of curriculum and assessment in New York and the adoption of the Strategic Plan by the Board of Regents. Teachers then participated in 4 sessions of workshops.

Approximately 170 people participated in this most successful conference. In addition, the conference resulted in 22 new members for our section. Our neighboring sections in NYC and Nassau benefitted with 6 new members! About 40 people responded to a post survey that Glen distributed electronically. Feedback was very positive. The keynote speaker was rated with all 5's and some 4's. People clearly preferred a Friday full-day conference. Most workshops were rated favorably.
